Students in the playground at St. Mary's Mission School.




As the new school year begins we welcome our new Principal Mrs. Alyssa Schindler and new elementary teacher Ms. Johanna Hoodie. Both who are very familiar with the students and families of St. Mary's Mission School. Elementary teacher Mr. Derek Nistler spent the summer studying at Notre Dame in South Bend, IN working on specific disciplines to become an impactful teacher for the Students of the Red Lake Nation. Needs for the St. Mary's Mission School include different basic school supplies for the students including coloring markers,



paper, whiteboard erasable markers, acoustic guitars for music class, as well as for teachers bulletin board borders, tag board, book carts, and curtains/drapes for windows in the classrooms.

On October 11, 1884 under the leadership of Chief Little Thunder, 112 members of Red Lake petitioned the Benedictine Abbot Alexius Edelbrock of St. John's Abbey in Collegeville, MN

to send Benedictines to run the parish and school at St. Mary's Mission. In 1889 the first permanent church and school were built with a gift of \$6,000 from the future St. Katherine Drexel. The current St. Mary's School east wing was built in



1929 with classrooms and a gymnasium and dedicated as Lautischar Memorial Hall after Fr. Lawrence Lautischar from Austria who served the needs of the people of Red Lake in the early years of St. Mary's Mission in the 1850's. This August a new roof was put on to replace the original one that was part of the 1966 four-room addition that was added on to what is now called Drexel Hall.

I rejoice heartily in the Lord for your sacrificial contributions in support of our efforts at St. Mary's Mission to further the love of Jesus Christ.

It is with great joy that I introduce myself as the new Principal of St. Mary's Mission School. Having had the honor of teaching 4th grade at St. Mary's Mission School, I am excited to serve in this new capacity. I am originally from Minnesota. I received my undergraduate degree from Butler University, my master's degree from Indiana University, and my PhD from the University of Minnesota. This is my 20th year as an educator, and I have served in a variety of different roles (classroom teacher, literacy interventionist, college professor, etc.).

Enrollment at St. Mary's Mission School continues to be around 60 students and we're excited to welcome even more students soon! We have a dynamic staff, and we welcomed a new PE teacher last year and a new 2nd/3rd grade teacher this year. We continue to offer small class sizes to better meet our learners' individual needs.
